WANTON: Compared to the wife of Potiphar. She promised Faithful, with a flattering tongue, all manner of fleshly and carnal contentment.

ADAM THE FIRST: Old man that lived in the town of Deceit. Faithful met him at the foot of the hill called Difficulty.

DECEIT: Town where Adam the First lived.

LUST OF THE FLESH: A passionate or overmastering desire or craving for things of the flesh. Daughter of Adam the First.

LUST OF THE EYES: A passionate or overmastering desire or craving for things seen. Daughter of Adam the First.

PRIDE OF LIFE: Things of this world that makes one have a inordinate opinion of oneself or this life. Daughter of Adam the First.

MOSES: Beat up Faithful half-way up the hill called Difficulty. Spares no one and knew not how to show mercy to those who transgress his law.

DISCONTENT: Dissatisfaction. A restless desire or craving for something one does not have. Tried to persuade Christian to go back with him because the valley was completely without honor and all his friends would be offended by his disobedience.

PRIDE: A high or inordinate opinion of one's own dignity, importance, merit, or superiority, whether as cherished in the mind or as displayed in bearing, conduct, etc.

ARROGANCY: Offensive display of superiority or self-importance; overbearing pride.

SELF-CONCEIT: An excessively favorable opinion of one's own ability, importance, wit, etc.

WORLDLY GLORY: Very great praise, honor, or distinction bestowed upon the things of this world.

SHAME: The painful feeling arising from consciousness of something dishonorable, improper, ridiculous, etc. done by oneself or another. A villain who Faithful met in the Valley.
